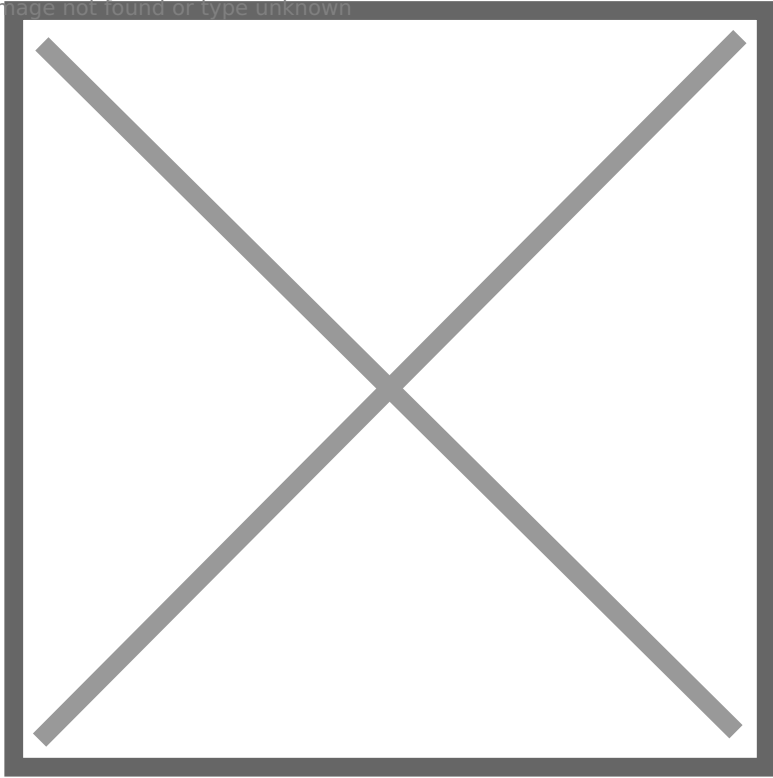


Nothing About Hawaiian Wildfire Makes Sense

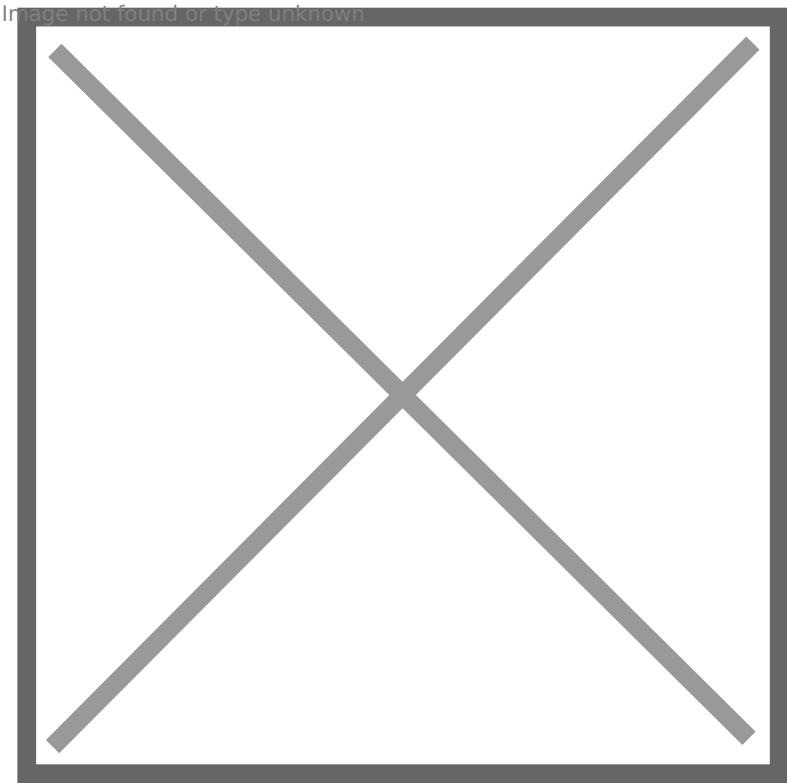
There doesn't appear to be a natural explanation for the the fire in Lahaina, Hawaii. Normal wild-land fires do not selectively remove buildings.

Island of Rhodes (23 July)

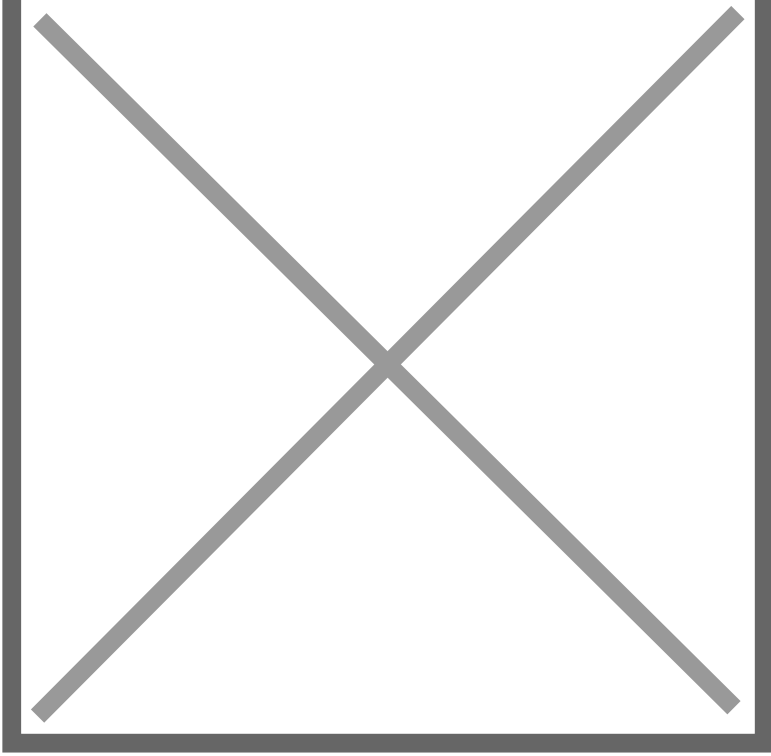


Brunot Island (25 July)



Tenerife Island (16 August)

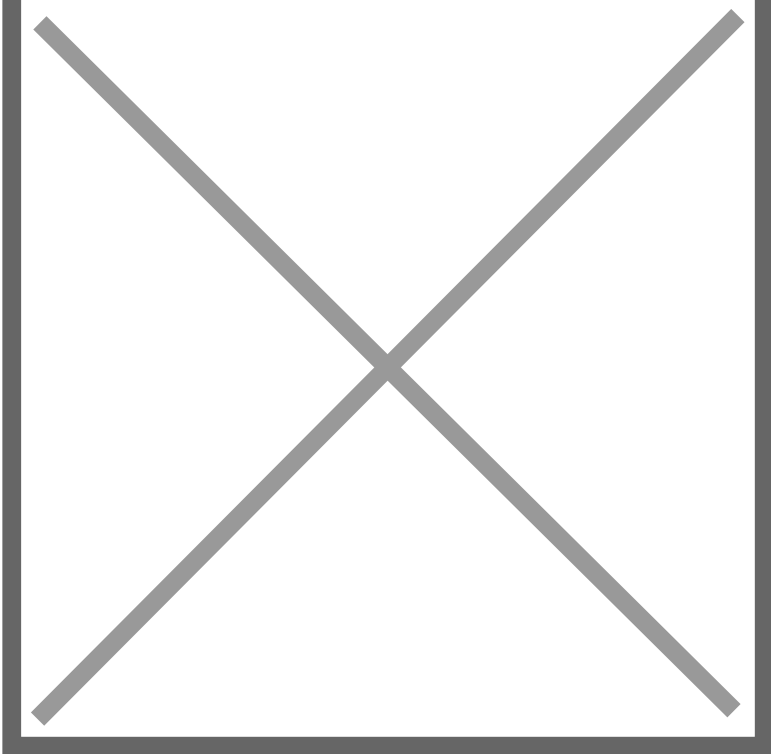
