


# Install Git via PowerShell

It's easy!

Run:

```
winget install --id Git.Git -e --source winget
```

Then you'll see something like:

```
Found Git [Git.Git] Version 2.42.0  
This application is licensed to you by its owner.  
Microsoft is not responsible for, nor does it grant any licenses to, third-party packages.  
Downloading https://github.com/git-for-windows/git/releases/download/v2.42.0.windows.1/Git-

The installer will request to run as administrator, expect a prompt.

```

Even though it says `The installer will request to run as administrator, expect a prompt.`, I was not required to enter an admin password, which is nice on an IT administered work laptop.

After installation, **close the PowerShell window!**

Open another PowerShell window and you should be able to check your **git** version:

```
git --version
```

You should see:

```
git version 2.42.0.windows.1
```

You're good to go!
