Those are all good programs and services that meet needs, minister to families and build up the Body of Christ. But... none of those programs or services or ministries are the mission of the Church.

Watchmen, please separate church *stuff* from the Church *mission*. We can become distracted by the good and helpful and generous; so much that we lose sight of the one mission—bring the world to Christ.

The world needs Jesus.

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WATCHMEN MAKE MISTAKES

"...in the last days mockers will come with their mocking, following after their own lusts, and saying, 'Where is the promise of His coming? For ever since the fathers fell asleep, all continues just as it was from the beginning of creation." (2 Peter 3:3-4)

On January 13, 2018, paradise surrendered to terror. "Ballistic missile threat inbound to Hawaii. Seek immediate shelter. This is not a drill." The faulty message happened because a worker clicked on the wrong option from a drop-down menu believing this was not a test. Three days later, a similar message went out from a Japanese news station announcing an incoming North Korean missile. Both sets of horrified recipients quickly learned the messages were in error, but "quickly" is an eternity to frightened young children and their parents.

The compassion I feel for these families and their past ordeal is not as great as what I fear for their future. What happens when the alarm is sounded again and this time, the threat is real? Each time a warning goes off with no actual associated danger, the recipient is increasingly unlikely to take shelter. It happens with smoke detectors; it can happen with the warnings Watchmen give too.

Watchmen dare not sound the trumpet when no real danger is approaching. We cannot proclaim imminent moral collapse and Jesus' return next week, based on our interpretation of changing fashions, musical beats, or celestial events. Yes, morals are collapsing, and Jesus is coming back. But not every change in society or in the sky is an indicator of the world's destruction.

Prayer

Father, I want to be balanced in my presentation of truth. Give me discernment and courage. Then I will know when to sound the alarm without hesitation or regret.

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ALL YOU HAVE IS ALL YOU NEED

"My God shall supply all your needs according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus." (2 Corinthians 9:8)

When you come to the place where Jesus is all you have, you realize Jesus is all you need. This piece could end right there.

I've been a teacher and coach at 3 Christian schools, a youth pastor, an assistant pastor, a marketing director overseeing 400 Christian bookstores, a board member of a non-profit that fights bullying, a published author, and now editor and cofounder of I Am A Watchman. 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PRAYING UNDERCOVER PRAYERS

"And rising very early in the morning, while it was still dark, he departed and went out to a desolate place, and there he prayed." (Mark 1:35)

Jesus often prayed alone and in private, just Him and His Father. Watchmen are God's spiritual covert operatives—unseen and unheard. A Watchman's work is often more effective because it is unrecognized. You may have never considered it, but you have the authority to pray undercover prayers. God can take your prayers anywhere.

Think of them as a Watchman's covert prayers.

People who would never speak to you in person have no defense against your prayers. Your prayers penetrate prison bars. Your prayers raid crack houses. Your prayers liberate enslaved children. Your prayers can go into places you could never go yourself. Prayers have unrestricted access to the enemy's strongholds because the Word says, "greater is He that is in you than he that is in the world." (1 John 4:4)

Today, focus on your intercessory prayer life. Pray for those who would least expect it, but most need it. Pray for Christ to become real to people who are searching for something, and they don't even know it's Jesus. Pray for other Watchmen. Pray God raises up more intercessors.

"Take heed, keep on the alert; for you do not know when the appointed time will come. It is like a man away on a journey, who upon leaving his house and putting his slaves in charge, assigning to each one his task, also commanded the doorkeeper to stay on the alert. Therefore, be on the alert—for you do not know when the master of the house is coming, whether in the evening, at midnight, or when the rooster crows, or in the morning—in case he should come suddenly and find you asleep. What I say to you I say to all, 'Be on the alert!" Mark 13:33-37 (NASB)

In the Garden of Gethsemane Jesus asked Peter, James, and John to "watch and pray" as He went into travail over His upcoming crucifixion. He even told them that he was grieved to the point of death. Yet they fell asleep – three times! We are told in Matt 26:41 that the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak. Even Jesus' most trusted advisors fell asleep on the job, even when He needed them the most!

In Mark 13:33 and Luke 21:36, we are told to be both watchful and in prayer regarding the last days. Watchfulness requires alertness, attentiveness, patience, and persistence. It requires discipline to stay vigilant and not fall asleep. The spirit is always willing, so it is a matter of getting our flesh to line up with our spirit.

As a Watchman, be diligent to keep your flesh submitted to your spirit so that you will be ready for whatever God is asking you to do or to pray. Who needs you to be alert and in prayer for them today?

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SETZING TODAY

"LORD, remind me how brief my time on earth will be. Remind me that my days are numbered-how fleeting my life is. You have made my life no longer than the width of my hand. My entire lifetime is just a moment to you; at best, each of us is but a breath." (Psalm 39:4-5)

My mother's first heart attack twenty years ago required quadruple bypass surgery lasting eight hours. The waiting was made a little more bearable due to the kindness of a man I did not know. This man was a pastor but not my mother's. He was the Bible teacher at the school where they both worked. To show love to a friend and her family, he took time to get someone else to watch the students he taught. I get the feeling he communicated more through his actions than his words.

He did not initiate many conversations, but he was available to talk when we felt the need. The words he offered informed us of the quarters weighing his pockets. He made them available if we needed to make a call.

I don't remember this man's name, but I remember his kindness. His actions didn't help the surgeon successfully complete his task. But he helped my family and me through a stressful day in our lives. A man whose profession relied on his mouth instead used his heart to meet our need.

Father, it's so easy to open my mouth and so hard to open my heart. I want to give kindness more than I give counsel. My words are so empty, but my heart has much to bestow.

"You know how to interpret the appearance of the sky, but not the signs of the times! A wicked and adulterous generation demands a sign, but none will be given it except the sign of Jonah." (Matt. 16:3,4)

The most accurate Sign of the Times is located in the New York City subway at the Grand Central stop. You'll find the sign above a blue box just outside the token turnstile. It says, "New York Times \$2.50."

Colored moons, magic math for 666, dates on calendars that didn't even exist when the Bible was written, will it ever end? What should Watchman do with all the information and the *dis*-information?

What is the most important End Times sign? The most important End Times sign is people will be begging for a sign. People don't need a sign, they need a Savior. Many people seek signs. Jesus is seeking the people.

As a Watchman, you know the core End Times Scriptures: Ezekiel 38; Revelation 6; Matthew 24; 1 John 4; Daniel 9; 1 Thessalonians 4. Ample current events information is available. It's essential every Watchman sees the truth, and how to explain it, but is that enough?

People could memorize Daniel and go to hell when they die. The world needs Jesus, not "signs." We can't answer all the questions, but we can focus on the Answer. You can be an effective Watchman by knowing one thing. Just one – the A-B-C's of salvation (Romans 10:9,10).

Signs Of The Times

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STAGEHAND OR SKEPTIC

"Behold, He is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see Him, and those who pierced Him, and all the tribes of the earth will wail because of Him. Yes! Amen!" (Revelation 1:7)

Christians see a different world. To say it more accurately; Christians see the same world, but they observe the people and activities unlike others watching the same event. Christians see more than the details, and because they see more, they get involved. Seeing isn't enough.

We read or hear the same news, whether on TV or online. We see the same terrorism and trauma. Yet, like Watchmen, we discern a different message.

Jack Hibbs is Senior Pastor of Calvary Chapel, Chino Hills; a frequent speaker on End Times programs and respected Bible Prophecy expert. He made this observation on the state of the world.

"In all that is going on in the world right now, believe it or not, God is at work. He's preparing things. We are not sensationalists on one end, and as the pendulum swings, we are not skeptics on the other end. So we're not skeptics, we're not sensationalists; as Bible-believers, what are we?

We're watching the stage be set. In a sense – with Bible open and news on – we are stage-setters."

Watchmen see the world through their own eyes, but they interpret what they see through God's heart.

And I will give the dead bodies of the host of the Philistines this day to the birds of the air and to the wild beasts of the earth, that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel." (1 Samuel 17:45,46)

Tough words from a soldier. Bold for a strong man, who's not a soldier. Defiant words from a youth with a sword. Brash words for a brave young man with a bow firing arrows from afar. Bizarre words from a teenager with an attitude, and a few rocks. Words of faith from a shepherd who knew nothing of war, but knew God well.

Watchman, you may come to this moment with no idea why God chose you, no ministry experience, and many questions.

The question is, how well do you know God?

David knew it was a big task—10 feet tall! He knew it was unfamiliar work. He knew other much better equipped and more experienced fighters were available. Why me?

Because you believe God is bigger than the problem. You don't tell God how big the problem is. You are the one who, like David, tells the problem how big your God is!

You have the one essential weapon for an epic victory. You have absolute faith in the One Who already won the battle. Your only function is to remind the enemy and everyone else, you serve the God Who wins this kind of battle all the time.

Prayer

God, I'm insignificant in the battle for eternity. You are all I need. I take confidence in the fact You gave me this role. I will speak Your words to the problem. The solution is in Your hands.

He stayed longer this time but soon wanted down. I don't know if he was uncomfortable because of the height or the lack of my arms wrapped around him.

The more times I put him high in the air without incident, the less fear he had; his trust grew. His endurance and daring also increased each time. He'd lean forward or backward and then side to side. We almost gave his mother a heart-attack multiple times as she stared at the two of us horsing around. The thing that once terrified him became his greatest desire. Whenever he said, "shoulders," I knew both of us were in for a ride.

How long has it been since you have ridden on your Father's shoulders? I know it can be scary. You feel so out of control. But that's where you are closest to your Father. It is there His voice is easiest to hear. And though your feet are not on the ground, they are enclosed in His arms. He won't let you fall. Enjoy the view.

Prayer

Father, being on Your shoulders is safe, but it can be scary. I've been there before; I'm there once again. Grow my trust, open my ears, and increase my view.

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HOT SPARKS, SHARP IRON

"As iron sharpens iron, so a person sharpens his friend." (Proverbs 27:17)

Many people quote that phrase "iron sharpens iron" but it's possible some of the quoters have never sharpened anything.

Things become 'dull' in many ways. People experience the same kind of erosion, often from the same conditions that cause a tool to become dulled: mishandling, improper use, striking at something tougher than the tool, an unexpected hidden object, overuse, age, or poor maintenance. We lose our 'edge' just from the constant wear and tear of life.

We need re-sharpened. When that's necessary, it's good to have that friend, old movie, song, book, or Bible verse, to sharpen our metal and make us functional and effective again. You should know a few tool-sharpening facts before you completely embrace being "sharpened." When you sharpen a metal object like an ax, or a knife, you will encounter some or all of the following:

- 1) Sparks will fly
- 2) A lot of heat will be generated
- 3) Dull tools don't always cooperate
- 4) Metal particles can get under your skin
- 5) It can be a noisy activity
- 6) It requires some abrasion
- 7) Even if done correctly, there's still a chance you'll get cut

Good friends and good habits keep us sharp, and that's a good thing, abrasive but good. It's important to remember that becoming productive, efficient, or empowered is not always a gentle process.

When "Iron sharpens iron..." we become more effective Watchmen.

David was a Watchman shepherd. The King duties might seem far removed from a sheepherder's, but many are the same. David was being prepared for the palace while he sang to sheep under the stars.

Kings lead the nation to prosperity and peace. Shepherds lead by still waters, in green pastures. A King is sworn to guard his people, so he faces the enemy. David guarded sheep and killed lions, bears, and a 9 ft. Philistine. Some roles were very different, yet God used both in similar ways. The king was venerated, and people bowed. Shepherds are lowly but were the only ones *invited* to the Kings birth.

How? Watchmen serve alone in the darkness. Why? We work for the King.

Watchmen are susceptible too. In our attempt to reach as many as possible, it can be tempting to go beyond Paul's example trying to be all things, to all people ...all the time.

Paul's objective (and ours) is to find a crack in the door that will allow us to reach someone's heart. For some it's relaxing the formalities; wear jeans to church. For others, a suit and tie are appropriate. If you are speaking to teens, you can joke about Miley Cyrus's latest haircut, but if you're talking to the seniors, it's better to joke about Wheel of Fortune.

In our desire to separate Christianity from worldliness, we've instead become separated from reality. A lost and dying world needs to hear the Gospel from someone who speaks their language, wears a pair of jeans, and might even occasionally listen to Country music.

Paul said, "...to all: become all, by all means, reach some. [Most importantly] I do it all for the Gospel.

Father, reveal where I've become ineffective because I only see the sin and not the sinner. I give you my life to be like You, and reach some.

"The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that **any** should perish, but that **all** should come to repentance." (2 Peter 3:9)

God loves numbers. He wrote a whole book about them!

Some have suggested certain numbers in the Bible have special significance. For example, seven is often connected to completion or divine perfection. God rested on day 7 of Creation. Isaiah 11:27 lists 7 qualities of Messiah, 7 priests blowing 7 trumpets marched 7 days around Jericho (Josh. 6:3,4). Forty is a common number in the Bible: 40 days and nights of rain (Gen. 7:4); Israel wandered 40 years; Jesus tempted 40 days and nights.

Numbers are an interesting Bible study, but in the overwhelming majority of uses in the Bible—numbers are just numbers. They won't help you win the lottery or find secret codes to discover where the Ark of the Covenant is hidden. However, you can find God's favorite number; not 7, or 40, or 490.

God's favorite number is zero.

Billy Graham died at age 99. Over a span of 50 years, he preached to billions through radio, TV, and city-wide crusades. He preached the Gospel to Presidents, professional athletes, astronauts, and Watchmen. There is not way to know how many people are in Heaven because of Billy Graham's ministry. His oldest grandson Will told one pastor, "It doesn't matter how many are in Heaven because of his ministry because he only cared about the zero. "God is not willing that any [zero] perish."

Watchmen will warn and rescue millions ... because they focus on zero.

Father, my focus is the world. One zero at a time.

Moses was different with God than any person before. Moses knew the Creator of the universe by reputation. It wasn't until the wilderness that God first spoke to Him.

Moses asked God, "Who are You? What is Your name?" God identified Himself as Jehovah—the Self-existent unchanging One. Moses lived his first forty years in a culture that celebrated multiple gods. They needed names to distinguish one from another. God is the only true One.

Why does God have a name, and who gave it to Him?

The first human went by "man." Man saw his wife and designated her "woman." She didn't answer to Eve until God made it clear she would birth children. When you're the only one of your kind, you don't need a name. What you are is fine.

But God *does* have a name. He chose it Himself. Moses was the first to ask and first to hear it. More than anything else, a name signifies the desire for relationship. His name deserves honor, but it also opens the door to a friendship.

Prayer

God, You deserve worship, but having a name means You want more. *I can be in a relationship with God?* It's amazing! Thank you for calling my name and telling me Yours.

With a smile on her face and the pressure relieved, she landed a triple-axle—something no other American female skater had achieved. It was her audition for an opportunity of a different sort. She wanted the chance to earn the mirror ball trophy from Dancing with the Stars.

Miss Nagasu endured a great deal of scrutiny from the press and probably from others. I tend to think her words reflect the stress she's been under most of her life rather than some desire for self-glory. I could be wrong. Only she really knows.

Only you know why you stand on the wall. Is it the thrill and adventure of never knowing what's next? Are you an adrenaline addict? Maybe you like putting a notch on your belt another demon defeated and another soul rescued. Your motivation could be protecting yourself and your loved ones. While these goals might not be bad, they don't rise to the height God requires.

We do it for Him because only He is worthy.

God, Your actions benefit me, You died for me. Yet there is no higher motivation than Your glory. My sacrifices benefit others when they bring You worship.

God moves in the gaps. I have these pauses in my purposes; they hesitate – breathe – then re-awaken. These pauses don't last, and when God's Presence fills them, they overflow every time, no matter how cavernous the original void.

Faith has phases – micro, but certain. They're instants, flashes, pulses; they're not planned, and I believe that's why God inhabits them. He loves to show up when we haven't planned His arrival.

God's plans aren't drawn in straight lines. They meander across the pages and arrive at exactly the right place at the perfect moment. A symphony score has gaps, but it wouldn't be a symphony without them.

God puts dashes where we would rather have a period or exclamation point. But "Wait" is not a four-letter word.

The Holy Spirit inserts a *while* where we'd rather have a *when*. Watchmen are familiar the pause between waves of battle. It's uneasy and tense. God is in that pause. The silence hasn't taken Him by surprise. He knows what is next and He loves to move in those moments.

Have you mapped God's exact landing zone? Erase the circle, stop filling in the cracks. Leave the hesitation where God put it. Gaps are God's favorite places.

"Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father which is in heaven." (Matthew 5:16)

Nehemiah had no cell phone. His Watchmen had only two warnings: on the same wall, a trumpet; far away, a fire. The scene from *The Lord of the Rings* shows this Watchman's communication. Wall-to-wall, city-to-city, mile-by-mile: "The enemy is near! Make ready!"

One Beersheba Watchman sees the enemy. He cannot yell to Jerusalem, so he lights his fire. The tall bright blaze is seen on Mt. Moriah. The Watchman in David's Tower forwards the warning North to Mt. Ebal. That Watchman sends light to Mt. Gerizim, Mt. Tabor passes it to Mt. Carmel. It is visible across the Sea of Galilee on Mt Hermon. What began with one tower soon reaches the entire country.

Watchmen understand it is not about your name, or your skills, or your title, or your experience. Only one thing matters – how bright is your light? Two things matter in these last days. They are profound yet solemn.

One, Watchman need to be connected. One Watchman with one light cannot reach the world. Many connected lights reach many.

Two, make the message clear. "Cry aloud, spare not, lift up thy voice like a trumpet, and show My people their transgression..." (Is. 58:1a)

How bright is our light Watchmen? Who hears our warning? How many lives are spared eternal judgment?

Prayer

Lord, today I will proclaim the truth with clarity and warmth, in truth and in love. I will not fear the enemy because I know You are my protection.

HOW BIG IS YOUR FAILURE?

"If we confess our sins He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:9)

God's plans are always bigger than your failures. You cannot make a mistake big enough, or fail miserably enough, that you become 'impossible' for God. You can never fail so much, God doesn't have the power to redeem you.

Maybe you wonder, "What if I do fail BIG?" God has a bigger plan for that too – restoration. Israel disobeyed God repeatedly, and God forgave and restored them. They failed again, God loved and restored. We fail. God restores. It is part of His plan for our lives. Is it so we can sin as much as we want and God just forgives and forgets? No. God restores because He knew we would sin and stumble.

Watchmen make mistakes. We are human, and humans sin. God is perfect. So, He has a perfect plan to restore us when we fail. God sees our sin, but He celebrates our victories and forgives our failures and sins when we ask. We fail. We disobey. We stumble. We confess and seek forgiveness. God picks us up and cleans us off.

If you are looking at your many mistakes, you are looking at the wrong thing. Our failure is always smaller than God's plans for recovery and restoration.

He has big plans, and bigger plans, and *much* bigger plans.

Prayer

Almighty God, I have failed many times. Please forgive, and restore, and renew Your purpose for me.

"And they went and made the grave secure, and along with the guard they set a seal on the stone." (Matt. 27:66)

How did the guards react when they found out they would be guarding Jesus' dead body? Angry because success would bring no glory or advancement? Relieved because the assignment was safe? Or embarrassed because their commanders apparently thought this was all they could handle? The Bible doesn't record their reaction, just their obedience.

Your current assignment may be something equally mundane or nonsensical. You may long for a place on the wall that has more action and carries more prestige. Know this: your position may have something to do with your skill and experience, but it has nothing to do with your value. Every portion of the wall needs a guard. The enemy can attack at the dung gate just as easily as he can at the valley gate.

The issue is not your appreciation for your assignment; the issue is your trust in the King.

He has placed you where He wants you and where He believes you can be of greatest service. So if you lead a church of 30, guard them with the same passion you would 3000. You never know what 30 well-protected saints can do. It only took 12 to turn the world upside down.

Forgive me, Father, for seeing any place of service you give as small. Please give me the motivation and vision I need to accept my position as a statement of your trust rather than as a manifestation of your displeasure.

THE END IS (PROBABLY) NEAR

"The end! The end has come upon the four corners of the land! The end is now upon you, and I will unleash my anger against you. I will judge you according to your conduct and repay you for all your detestable practices." (Ezekiel 7:3)

Many believe these are the Last Days; this scribe among them. A dear family friend is one of those famous TV hosts who expected the Rapture since his 40's. He's now 90+ and still expecting the Rapture in his lifetime. I tease he may need to live to 150, and he might.

Now, the part we avoid: the simple fact is, the Rapture may *not* happen today. Paul thought he was living in the last days, as did John, author of Revelation. Mathematically, if Christ returns anytime between now and the year 3840, His return is still closer to my lifetime than John's.

That verse, clearly in the present tense, was written between 593 and 571 BC, and Ezekiel expected its imminent fulfillment.

It's 2018. Every Scripture which must be fulfilled before the Rapture has been fulfilled. So, should Christians panic or prophesy? Neither. It's time for the Church to engage, not enrage; to plead, not protest. The unsaved will still be here tomorrow if the Rapture occurs today. Will what the Church believes about homosexuality, or smoking, or politics, or rap music save the world? I'm not suggesting churches avoid tough subjects, I'm saying that message won't save people from Hell.

If you're going to have a message, and every Watchman must make it a message that matches God's greatest message – a Person. A Gift. His Love.

Father, I commit to love, not alienate the world. Increase my love for the lost.

"Rest in the Lord, and wait patiently for Him..." (Psalm 37:7)

Life isn't running, or flying, or fleeting—it's evaporating. Life isn't stationary. It is played at the speed of Olympic ping-pong, not world championship chess.

A lifetime includes years, months and days; but also minutes, seconds and moments. We love some moments that end too quickly. Others last longer than they should—some seem to last forever.

One traffic light near our home stops me every time. I don't think I've ever arrived when it was green. Not only does it make me stop, it always makes me late - for work, church, doctor's appointments. "How is this possible?" I wonder. So one day I decided to time the light. "Just exactly how long is it red? It must be 10 minutes, or at least 5." I thought. No, thirty-eight seconds. The light stays red only 38 seconds! Why does 38 seconds feel like forever?

On the other end, I can hold one of my grandkids for hours, and it seems like I have to let them go too soon. Time with Jesus feels that way. When I'm in His presence, time stands still. When I hear Him speak, or see His power at work for me, it never lasts long enough.

In all our watching, and warning, and serving, Watchmen must stop and enjoy the moments God gives us.

A BOUNDARY I WILL NOT CROSS

"There is no one greater in this house than I, and he has withheld nothing from me except you, because you are his wife. How then could I do this great evil and sin against God?' As she spoke to Joseph day after day, he did not listen to her to lie beside her or be with her." (Gen. 39:9-10)

Joseph didn't know it yet, but God had sent him to Egypt to provide a wall of protection between the famine and his family. Joseph's ability to submit to the limitations of his environment and of his God eventually enabled him to bestow generous blessings on those he loved. Joseph knew the value of walls. Not everyone around him shared his appreciation.

Potiphar's wife almost derailed God's purpose for Joseph. She, who had never learned boundaries, propositioned him expecting he would have tired of the walls he endured. "How could Joseph say no to the open gate I put before him?" she thought.

So imagine her dismay when the man who had previously refused none of her demands had the gall to say "NO" to this one. We do not know how strong Joseph's temptation was. We do know the strength of his wall. It held. Persistent bombardment could not bring it down, nor could it produce any cracks. His wall went up long before it came under attack.

As a Watchman, the most important wall you guard is the wall you build around yourself. You can't protect them if your wall goes down. Determine some boundaries in your life that you *refuse* to cross. Don't wait until you're under attack to evaluate your defenses. By then, it will be too late.

Prayer

Father, strengthen the barriers I have established for my protection. If I fall, how will I ever be able to help those you've put in my care?

Watchmen have that. People want to be around them, and when they walk away they feel different. Some of that God stuff rubbed off. It goes with them all day. It's just there. Where does it come from? How can you get more? One way. Spend time in God's Presence. I don't know any other way.

Father, I want to reflect You so powerfully people notice. I will carry You with me today; touching what I touch, speaking through my voice, rubbing off on people who need You.

DAY 45 FAMOUS DORCAS

October 15th, 2018 was a sad day. Dorcas Reilly, age 92, passed away. Who was she? A scientist? A professor? A doctor? No, Dorcas was an inventor.

According to the Campbell's Soup Company, some 20 million American households will celebrate the famous invention of Dorcas Reilly this Thanksgiving. What is it? Campbell's calls it, "the mother of all comfort foods." It's famous 6 ingredients take just ten minutes to prepare and 30 minutes to bake. What did Dorcas Reilly create that is now so famous? She called it, Green Bean Bake. My family calls it, "green bean casserole."

In 2002, Reilly's original yellow recipe card was placed in the National Inventor's Hall of Fame. It shares that honor with Edison's lightbulb, and Enrico Fermi's first controlled nuclear reactor; not bad company.

What will people remember about you when you're 93? Will it be a recipe? What about a book you wrote or a class you taught? What will your family talk about at your funeral? When an old high school classmate discusses you with a friend, they'll begin with, "Remember the time..." How will that sentence end?

What are you doing now, Watchman? What did you say today that will be remembered? What did you do that changed a life? Ten deeds? Two? One? They add up. You don't become Dorcas Reilly ON your 92nd birthday. You become that person one day at a time; beginning today.

Lord, give me the words or the actions, that will touch someone's today and change their tomorrow and forever.

IS YOUR WARNING WORKING?

"so that we may speak forth the mystery of Christ, for which I have also been imprisoned; that I may make it clear in the way I ought to speak. Let your speech always be with grace, as though seasoned with salt, so that you will know how you should respond to each person." (Colossians 4:2-6)

Watchmen warn well.

You warn – lovingly, clearly ...repeatedly. You faithfully pray from your wall. Yet no one listens, nothing changes. You're warning, but are you warning well? When you speak does your city understand the danger?

If you're warning with no response, examine the delivery; not the message, the method, not the need. If you're offering Christ and no one is saying yes, it's not because Christ isn't needed.

"Jesus is coming. Get ready." Easy to deliver, but difficult to accept. Jesus IS the only hope, and He IS returning, but if no one cares it may be time to change your approach or language. The Bible has 31,000 verses. Quote your message differently. God wrote the message multiple ways. Quote a new version. Explain a Watchman's duty to a friend. Do they understand? If not, strangers definitely won't.

If a tornado is coming you don't say, "It's windy." That's not urgent enough. If you are yelling, "I see ants on a stick!" That's urgent, but people don't care. Speak the truth in love and urgency so people listen and understand and get saved. Deliver the message so people notice, their eternity depends on it.

Prayer

Father God, Give me the method to make the message clear. Give me a fresh understanding of what is most important to the world. Give me the words to make the message clear so I can make the message important. Give me a *new* way to deliver an *old* message.

LADDER TO HEAVEN

"And he dreamed, and behold, there was a ladder set up on the earth, and the top of it reached to heaven. And behold, the angels of God were ascending and descending on it!" (Genesis 28:12)

Jacob saw angels ascending and descending a ladder. The ladder had no profound theological meaning; it was an illustration, not a critical detail. God wasn't giving Jacob a lesson about how angels get in and out of Heaven. God wanted Jacob to see He was actively working all around him. The point of the vision was not ladders, angels, or even Heaven; it was about God and Jacob.

Watchmen, God wants your full attention. Signs (and videos) are everywhere. It's easy to be distracted by the events of prophecy and forget the Person. Say, "End Times" and people think Revelation. The very first verse tells us the book of Revelation is about a Person.

"This is the revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave Him to show His servants what must soon come to pass. He made it known by sending His angel to His servant John, who testifies to everything he saw. This is the word of God and the testimony of Jesus Christ." (Revelation 1:1)

Know prophecy details; the signs, characters, and activities are important. But don't let the action obscure the main point.

The world needs to know Jesus is coming, but more importantly, they need to know God is already here, and He loves them. Jesus IS the Revelation!

Prayer

In Genesis and through much of the Old Testament people lived for hundreds of years. The average lifespan of the Patriarchs was 612 years! Men like Adam, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Jacob, Joseph, Methuselah, Cainan, and Isaac ranged from Joseph who died at age 110, to the Methuselah who lived to 969! Adam, Enos, Seth, Cainan, Jered, Methuselah, Mahalaleel and Noah all lived to be more than nine hundred years old. That was then. The latest figures show the life expectancy in the US is about 78 years; a little less for men, more for women. The year I was born the average life expectancy was 54. I'm beyond that already. My parents are way ahead, they're 85! But honestly, they don't expect to live till they're 100. Their bodies aren't the same. They have aches that weren't there only a few years ago; so do I.

We are under construction for our years on earth. We were not created to live here for a thousand years; we were created to live in Heaven for eternity. Christ is our life, our peace, or reason for life now and the reason we have eternal salvation. We have one function while we live – tell as many others as we possibly how they can have eternal life.

"If God answered the prayers you're praying, would it change anyone's world but your own?"

Wow. Oh. ...and Ouch.

"God Please..."

God sees and loves the entire world. We have a human connection to that power—the Holy Spirit. Because the Holy Spirit empowers our daily ministry, we need to pray God's power and Presence into the world around us. What did my prayers sound like this week? "God, watch over my... Father fix my... Lord, heal my... They were prayers for me. Is that wrong?

Christ calls us not just to tolerate our enemies, but to *love* them. To *pray* for them. Even to serve them! The Lord sees our efforts and blesses them. If our overtures of peace fail and our words of faith fall on deaf ears, we can shake the dust from our feet and move on. We can stand strong for ourselves and for Christ without being taken advantage of, and without seeking vengeance.

Pray for a clear path to freedom for yourself and your enemies through the muddy waters of worldly justice.

From Israel's perspective, two threats faced them that day. Not until the next morning did they understand. The obstacle before them was the pathway to escape the enemy determined to destroy them.

Who Am I? Your Humble Watchman

"And David said to Saul, "Who am I, and who are my relatives, my father's clan in Israel, that I should be son-in-law to the king?" (1 Sam. 18:18)

One of the most powerful statements in the Bible is a question – Who am I? It is not a question of self-discovery. It is a question that is a declaration, not declaring who I am, but declaring Who God is.

Who am I – unworthy. Who am I – undeserving. Who am I – the least of the lowest of the low. God, who am I to deserve Your love or mercy or grace?

Prophets and kings, Elizabeth, the mother of John the Baptist, and Paul, who wrote half the New Testament. We know who they are, and yet each of them humbly asked some form of the same question – Who am I?

The implied answer is, I'm nobody. I'm nothing special. I don't deserve this mercy or special favor. David didn't see himself as Goliath-killer King of Israel. He knew it was only possible with God. That is the key, for these amazing saints and for us—it's never what we can do, it's all about what God can do.

David asked the same question each of us should ask. Who am I that I should be a child of the King of Kings. Who are we to be loved by God?

And He said, 'Certainly I will be with you, and this shall be the sign to you that it is I who have sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall worship God at this mountain." (Exodus 3:11,12)

If you know who you are, you'll know what to do.

Moses was a keeper of flocks, a herdsman. He owned sheep, camels, oxen – maybe hundreds of animals. We would more likely call him a rancher. If you asked Moses, he would have told you proudly that he was a herdsman; and a very successful one. But that would change.

God chose Moses to be a leader of people – thousands, hundreds of thousands, eventually millions. That's a leap from shepherd. It was more than a change of what he did, it was a change of who he was.

Moses' Who am I? moment was one we all need to have. When Moses asked Who am I? the answer did not reveal who Moses was, it revealed Who God was.

When Moses asked God, "Who should I say sent me?" God answered, "Thus you shall say to the sons of Israel, 'I AM has sent me to you." (Ex. 3:14) Moses, who are you now?

Who are you? Are you a business-Watchwoman who owns a media firm? Are you a Watchman-plumber? Or are you retired after a little of each? Your vocation is not your calling. It doesn't matter what's on your business card. Lord, Who am I ...now?

Father, I am Your Watchman. You have re-created me and prepared me for a new purpose. Who I am now, I cannot be without You.

Solomon is King of Israel. By his God-given wisdom and political savvy, he increased the wealth and status of Israel. He was envied by peers, feared by enemies, wealthy beyond imagination, and renowned as a great ruler.

Solomon's Temple would be grand and majestic, suited for the God of the universe. He assembled craftsmen and tons of gold and silver and the finest cedar, and tapestries.

The project took 7 years. To build the temple today, using those materials; it would cost over \$800 billion. Add the cost of housing and feeding 180,000 workers for 7 years. Include the cost of the grand opening, and the total cost in today's market would be about \$1.3 trillion dollars!

The first Temple—Solomon's Temple. Yet King Solomon said, "Who am I to build a house for God?" Who are you? You're king! No one deserves it more. You *literally* paid for it.

Watchmen invest heavily, personally and emotionally in their calling. They "pay the price." Watchmen serve God, not for accolades or personal gain.

Solomon saw more value in the purpose than the praise. Your work is just as valuable to God as the Temple – more – God didn't *need* a house. He does need you.

Saul and Jonathan were killed in battle. As Mephibosheth's nursemaid fled the palace in fear, she dropped him and both his feet were broken. He would spend his life lame.

David becomes king, Mephibosheth becomes, well, nobody. Then one day... "David said, "Is there still anyone left of the house of Saul, that I may show him kindness for Jonathan's sake?" (2 Samuel 9)

Mephibosheth is located and brought to the palace. Imagine his reaction. "I'm the last heir of Saul. Is this the end?" David's motives are entirely the opposite. He restores to Mephibosheth all the land his family owned and decrees that the crippled boy eat at the king's table the rest of his life.

This is one of the most beautiful and prophetic moments we will ever see in Scripture. Mephibosheth, by no power of his own, and with no right to anything is given a place at the king's table. Not because he deserved it, not because he earned it, but for one reason alone – who his father was. Rightly, Mephibosheth asked, "Who am I to deserve a place in the King's house?"

We are broken, like Mephibosheth, by no fault of our own. We deserve nothing, and yet we are given everything—life, salvation, and eternity at the King's table. Because of Who our Father is.

Prayer

Lord, I deserve none of the blessings you give. I serve at Your pleasure. I proudly tell anyone who listens that I belong to You.

WHO AM I - ELIZABETH

"When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. Elizabeth's conception was a miracle. Her son would be John the Baptist. Mary visited Elizabeth because they were family and because they were both carrying miracle babies. The verses above describe that visit.

Yet Elizabeth made the same statement as others - "Who am I?"

Was Elizabeth unworthy because of sin in her life? No, in fact quite the opposite. Luke 1:6 records, "They were both righteous in the sight of God, following all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord blamelessly."

You faithfully serve the Lord. You have a clean public 'record.' Of course, you've sinned, but not in some egregious way that brought reproach on the name of Christ. You're Elizabeth or Zechariah.

This righteous woman, with a miracle child in her womb, must have felt an incredible favor from God. She could have pointed to her service record and said, "See, I deserve this!" but she did not.

Elizabeth's "Who am I?" came from a humble heart. She had a clean record publicly before the 'church' and privately before God. Elizabeth asked "Who am I?" not because of her unfaithfulness, but in comparison to God's faithfulness.

Prayer

DAY 61 WHO AM I — JOB

"So who am I, that I should try to answer God or even reason with Him?

Even if I were right, I would have no defense. I could only plead for mercy." (Job 9:14,15)

Have you ever wondered, for a nano-second, "Does God know what He's doing?" Job may have. Read Job 1:13-19.

While tending Job's 500 donkeys and 1,000 oxen, his workers are robbed and killed; all but one, who escaped to inform Job. Verse 16, 17 and 18 all begin the same, "While he was still speaking..." As herdsman number one is describing one event, shepherd number two stumbles in choking, "7,000 sheep gone. Shepherds slain." He's interrupted by guy number three – "3,000 camels taken, ...all herdsmen... dead."

While he is still speaking, guy four crawls into Job's house. "A tornado destroyed your oldest son's house!" My ten children? "All dead."

That entire scene could have unfolded in five minutes! Nightmare? Worse. Reality. Eight chapters of suffering later Job says, "Who am I to reason with God?" Job felt the anguish, yet at the moment most would have lost all hope, Job saw what others could not. He saw his life – good and evil, painful and pleasant – as one story. Job's biography, authored by God.

This scribe lost his wife suddenly. Friday with me, Saturday with Jesus. In one of those moments, we can say, Why me? Or we can say, Who am I that the Lord gave me 24 blessed years?

We, the creation, could argue with our Creator. Let that sink in.

The LORD looked at him and said, "Go in this your strength and deliver Israel from the hand of Midian. Have I not sent you?" He said to Him, "O Lord, how shall I deliver Israel? Behold, my family is the least in Manasseh, and I am the youngest in my father's house." But the LORD said to him, "Surely I will be with you, and you shall defeat Midian as one man." (Judges 6:12-16)

God declared Gideon a "mighty warrior" before he did a single thing. That was how God saw Gideon. The second part was how Gideon saw Gideon. We know God spoke the truth, but so did Gideon.

To Gideon, it was simple—family. You can pick your friends, but you're stuck with relatives! The least (youngest) in his house—can't change that either. When Gideon thought, "Who am I?" did he say, "Who are You calling warrior?" God saw what Gideon did not, and He said what Gideon had never heard. Only God's opinion matters. How do we get past our view, and see God's view?

- Stop calling yourself what God does not. God doesn't call you stupid, or failure, or worthless, or second-class.
- Begin calling yourself what He has already declared over you. Blessed. Anointed. Gifted. Family.
- Re-name the worst of your faults, it only takes a little practice. "My ugly scarred knee" becomes, "My epic skateboard fail trophy" Or, "My Horrible hair-day" is, "See how I rock this all natural look!"
- Declare the man or woman you and God want you to be. "My past is only God's beginning." And, "God sees me finished, complete and holy."

Jesus is at God the Father's side, always interceding. (Rom. 8:34) What does <u>God</u> hear Jesus calling you?

Father, today I will live out the name You have given me. Warrior. Princess. Valued. Forgiven. Yours.

WHO AM I - KING DAVID

King David is called "a man after God's own heart" (Acts 13:22). Was David perfect? No, he had weaknesses and downfalls. His failures affected an entire nation. What elevated David above all that failure to become a man after God's own heart? One thing—he understood God's heart. David wrote,

"I waited patiently for the LORD; He inclined to me and heard my cry. He drew me up from the pit of destruction, out of the miry bog, and set my feet upon a rock, making my steps secure. He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise to our God. many will see and fear, and put their trust in the LORD." (Psa. 40:1-3)

Watchmen are not perfect. If that were a job requirement, only God would qualify. Perhaps your downfalls - like David's - were visible, excruciating ...and repeated. Maybe your blunders weren't made in public, but private failure is just as painful.

David knew failure all too well. His failures were, well... royal. When David asked, "Who am I?" he knew God knew his past. David knew God's heart because he had broken it. Do you know God's heart? If you do, you know He forgives.

Prayer

Lord Jesus, I've fallen from the wall ...again. I have sinned against You, but I want to be used by You. I beg Your forgiveness, cleansing, healing, and restoration.

"...as I swore to you by the LORD, the God of Israel... 'Solomon your son shall reign after me, and he shall sit on my throne in my place,' even so will I do this day." Then Bathsheba bowed with her face to the ground and paid homage...and said, "May my lord King David live forever!" (1 Kings 1:30,31)

David and Bathsheba's story is ugly, sordid, murderous, sad; yet, when David died, Bathsheba's son Solomon became king. Several centuries later – Christ appears in her lineage. (Matt. 1:6)

David was to blame for the affair. He ordered her husband's murder. He could have easily (and lawfully) sent her away, or had her executed, but he showed mercy. Bathsheba also sinned, and she knew she was at the king's mercy. Her statement, "May my lord King David live forever!" was her way of saying, "Don't you remember what I've done? Why bless me? Who am I?"

Have you ever felt that sentiment: one part joy, one part remorse; half shame, half devotion? "God, are you sure you meant *me*? Don't you remember when I..." No, He doesn't remember.

Isaiah 43:25 says, "I—yes, I alone—will blot out your sins for My Own sake and will never think of them again."

I am not worthy of this Watchman calling, nor are you, none of us. We are not here by our merit, we are here at the mercy and grace of the King. He owes us nothing, yet He gave us His Only-begotten Son. Who are we?

Prayer

God, thank You for Your mercy. Today I will demonstrate that mercy to someone who does not deserve it. Thank You for a calling that allows me the highest privilege – the privilege to be like You.

"And I fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to me, 'Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?' And I answered, 'Who are you, Lord?' And He said to me, 'I am Jesus of Nazareth, Whom you are persecuting.' Now those who were with me saw the light but did not understand the voice of the One who was speaking to me. And I said, 'What shall I do, Lord?' And the Lord said to me, 'Rise, and go into Damascus, and there you will be told all that is appointed for you to do." (Acts 22:7-10)

Saul was a good man, not only in his eyes, in society as well. He was a respected teacher in the synagogue—Rabbi Saul. He knew the Hebrew Bible backward. (some of you got it) Paul was a businessman, and a Christian-killer. He hunted Christians down and presided over their deaths. That was Saul. Then came Paul.

The man described in Acts 22 had an encounter with Jesus. That's something you never forget. Saul was the least likely convert. He was feared by the Christian community, and he liked that reputation. God had another plan. The risen Christ appeared to Saul and gave him a new heart, a new profession, and a new name—Paul. Imagine his reaction when the risen Christ spoke to him out loud, in a bright light, in the middle of the Damascus road. Others with Saul saw the light and heard something, but didn't know it was Christ. Saul's eyes were blinded by the Light, but opened to the truth.

I'm Saul, the murderer! Who am I to warrant a vision of Christ Himself? Who am I to be spared the penalty I imposed on others? Who am I? Jesus answered the questions with one statement. "You are no longer Saul."

Prayer

Lord, I am no longer me, I'm Yours. My new heart and new mind have a new message. Give me new words to share it.

who am I — paul the apostle

"For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God." (1 Corinthians 15:9)

The apostle Paul wrote at least 14 books of the New Testament and planted at least 14 churches (likely closer to 20). Ephesians and Galatians were written to "the churches..." Philipi began with two house churches. Paul also mentored young pastors of those churches, and they would have started more churches like their mentor Paul.

Paul was mightily used by God, but Paul was also imprisoned, shipwrecked, tortured and left for dead, and ultimately beheaded for his faith in Christ. With that impressive résumé, Paul was probably the second most prominent character in New Testament teaching; second only to Christ.

Paul said, "Follow me as I follow Christ." (1 Cor. 11:1) His obedience began the DNA chain that would spread the Gospel across the Roman Empire and into Asia. Simple obedience is powerful; more powerful than spiritual gifts, programs, strategies or personalities.

Who are you, Paul? Who am I? Just an unworthy, imprisoned, beaten, hunted and hated obedient servant. I've never been any of those except obedient servant. What about you Watchman? You do not need to be tortured to be obedient. Follow Christ. Mentor others. Sow seeds of obedience, and trust the harvest to God.

Prayer

Father God, who am I to be trusted with Your plans? I do not see how much or how little may come from my simple obedience, but I will obey.

WHO AM I - ALL CREATION

"Wherefore God also hath highly exalted Him, and given Him a name which is above every name: That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Phil. 2:9-11)

The book of Philippians was written in Greek. The Greek word translated "every" is a very unique and specific term. It means, every. Not many, not most, not the majority—<u>every</u>. Paul writes, "Every knee will bow…" Just to make sure there is no confusion, he lists all the possibilities: spiritual beings, human beings, animals, plants, angels, demons, things on the earth, inside the earth, above the earth (as in the universe).

Every

Paul wrote Philippians. He was an educated man. He held an elevated social status as a Pharisee. He had traveled through much of the known world. He was respected by ordinary men and women, and professionals like himself. He knew God's Word. He would, one day, be responsible for writing half the New Testament. Paul was a business owner, church planter, mentor to young pastor Timothy and martyr for his faith.

Paul understood authority. When he wrote that every knee will bow, he was making a statement for his time and for our time and for a time yet to come. One day, the entire world will be responsible for how they treated Jesus. How they treated Him? He's been gone for 2000 years! Yes. Which makes the above verses even more important.

Watchmen understand authority. They know that 'every' is on the way. Warn as if 'every' was tomorrow.

Prayer

Lord, today I will make it clear to someone, that everyone, will one day answer for how they treated You.

"But now, O LORD, You are our Father, we are the clay, and You our potter; And all of us are the work of Your hand." (Isaiah 64:8)

The potter and clay are a vivid description of God and us. If you've worked with clay, you understand. It's appalling but appealing. Equally hopeful and dismal. It's messy but gratifying. In the end, it's an original; a perfect reflection of the potter's mastery.

Isaiah: "Shall the potter be considered equal with the clay, that what is made would say to its maker, "He did not make me"; or what is formed say to him who formed it, "He has no understanding?" (Isaiah 29:16)

Jeremiah: "But the pot he was shaping from the clay was marred in his hands; so the potter formed it into another pot, shaping it as it seemed best to him..." (Jeremiah 18:4)

Job: "I too am a piece of clay." (Job 33:6)

Paul: "Has not the potter power over the clay, of the same lump to make one vessel to honor, and another to dishonor?" (Romans 9:21)

The potter removes un-moldable rocks. He kneads it like dough to loosen stiffness. He removes air bubbles—they explode under heat. He marks the base with his name. Then, the clay is baked and becomes a useful, beautiful creation.

Who are we? Eventually beautiful and perfect—for now, Clay.

Prayer

Lord, I submit to the process. Mold me and make me useful. Create what You need me to be, out of what I am not.

There are two things a human cannot live without – food and water. You would die without food after 45-50 days. Most people could last only ten days without water. Jesus represents both, the Living Water and the Bread of Life.

When Jesus saw a need, He met it: wine, vision, hearing, freedom, rescue, light, forgiveness, food or water. Whatever the needs, He met them. He illustrated many truths using food or water. He fed 20,000 with fish and bread, made wine for the wedding celebration, and cooked a campfire breakfast for eleven discouraged disciples.

Anyone who believes in Christ as Savior will have eternal life (John 6:47). So when Watchmen tell the world about Jesus, they are literally saving people's lives—for eternity. Jesus is the Water, but we are the well. "He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." (John 7:38)

We must be a well of fresh water. No one wants to drink from the swamp or the mud puddle. Be a clean well. Be a refreshing well. Be that source people go to when they need life, eternal life.

Clean out the fungus and mud and dead fish. Be a living water source for someone who is dying of spiritual thirst.

Momentary anger, eternal favor—fair deal.

The world title boxing match was set. The winner would get 5 million dollars, the loser, 1 million. A fan said, "I'd take one punch for a million dollars!" He figured the pain of one punch would be worth the money. Another man said, "You'd never live to spend it."

God's anger follows sin, rebellion, rejecting His Son. We're also told God grieves over sin (Gen. 6:6; Eph. 4:30). Jesus grieved that the Pharisee's hearts were so hardened against the truth.

"And Jesus looked around at them with anger, grieved at their hardness of heart, and said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He stretched it out, and his hand was restored." (Mark 3:5)

God is holy, just and righteous. We are none of those without Him. We deserve anger and wrath; we have all grieved Him, and He is justly angered over sin. We can imagine God saying, "You'll pay for this!" but God loves us. His anger lasts only until Jesus to leans over and says, "I already paid for that sin."

"Therefore He is able to save completely those who come to God through Him, because He always lives to intercede for them." (Heb. 7:25)

Watchmen are privileged to share the good news to balance their warnings. God's not angry, and... His favor lasts a lifetime.

We fail. We fall short (Romans 3:23). We are not perfect. We are human, but when we rely on Christ, we have access to all that He is and all He can do. The perfect God of the universe gives His sons and daughters, ALL of His ALL.

No need is too big. No prayer is beyond His ability. God is never barely enough. He is always more than enough. God is *WAY* more than we need, and when we need more, He is more.

He is proving His perfection by perfecting your heart.

You see the world with singularity. One reason you walk your wall is your ability to see from God's perspective. You see the world at its worst and its best. You are privileged to view people as God does.

God will bring someone to you today who desperately needs to be valued. Watch for that person, then open your heart. Hear what God would say if He were there, then say it.

Some people feel valued when they know they're needed. Some feel valued when they are recognized for their accomplishments in public. Others feel valued when you compliment their appearance. Some receive an act of kindness as value. Today, your mission is not warning, it is adding value to people.

Approval is not bestowed, and cannot be purchased. Approval is not the automatic result of a completed checklist. Approval carries disclaimers.

"study to show yourself approved." Study, show – think quiz.

You are approved. You need no external validation. God values you so much His only Son died for you. Demonstrate how much God values you by valuing others. People listen when you make them feel important, noticed, valued. Say it. Show it. Repeat it.

Prayer

Lord, I want to prove to the world You value them. Show me who needs to feel valued today. I will sow seeds, and trust You to grow the fruit. Today, each time I hear Your voice and feel Your value I will value someone else.

Children aren't afraid to ask when they need help, or relief, or safety. God Almighty has invited us into His throne room! (Psalm 100:4) If you knew that your daddy had a gift for you, something you would love...would you refuse it or would you ask to have it, maybe even beg? "Pleeeeze Daddy!"

His eyes adjusted to the light, and the rays revealed the enemy surrounding the city. He ran to wake Elisha with the terrible news of their impending death. The servant had to have been surprised at Elisha's lackadaisical reaction.

Elisha had an advantage. Though his eyes were closed, his vision was not clouded. He saw with eyes of faith. Yes, the enemy surrounded the city. But God's forces surrounded the enemy.

The enemy's greatest weapon is to strike us with fear. When you are tempted to give the enemy more credit than he is due, remember there are less with him then there are with me and you. God's got this!

Men and women like Adam, Noah, Sarah, Esther, Abraham, all have very different Bible stories told in various books, but many of them shared Adam's family tree (some of you got that). Genealogies in Numbers, Chronicles, and Genesis, prove their lives overlapped.

Adam and Noah's father Lamech lived concurrently. Adam surely told the creation story to Lemech. Noah heard the creation story from his dad, who heard it directly from Adam. Abraham and Noah shared the planet for almost 100 years. Imagine that family reunion – Noah and Abraham telling stories! "Nice yacht. How many camels does it take to tow that thing?"

This scribe's family is spread across the country, New York to California. We are separated by great distance, but we are connected by the stories we tell. I love hearing them talk about things they remember.

What we know about God, His Word, the Church, the End – it makes us the Watchmen and Watchwomen we are today. What we pass on determines the spiritual heritage of the next generation.

Your story, like Adam's, is the key to someone's spiritual life and possibly their eternity. Learn much. Live well. Pass it on.

PLANT - WATT

"Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will **reap** a **harvest** if we do not give up." (Gal. 6:9)

"Sow righteousness for yourselves, reap the fruit of unfailing love, and break up your unplowed ground; for it is time to seek the LORD, until He comes and showers His righteousness on you." (Hosea 10:12)

"Those who **sow** in tears shall **reap** with shouts of joy! He who goes out weeping, bearing a trail of **seed**, will surely return with shouts of joy, carrying sheaves of **grain**." (Psa. 126:5,6)

"Those **sowing** in tears, with singing do **reap**" (Psa. 126:5)

The examples of Planting and Harvesting (or Sowing and Reaping) are found throughout the Bible. It is an essential principle which illustrates God's faithfulness (Psalm 31:23), justice for good or evil (Galatians 6:7), how we influence the world around us as Watchmen (Matthew 13:32), salvation and eternal life (Mark 4:13-20), and the rewards that await us in Heaven someday (Proverbs 11:18).

It's an incredibly gratifying experience to plant something that grows from a tiny seed until it eventually becomes a fruit or vegetable or product you can eat or use. It's a process I know well, because I grew up on a farm. I remember when I was very young planting the seeds, then running out there every day to check on my beans or corn or tomatoes. I wanted to see them all grown and ready to eat, but that process takes weeks or months.

For a 5-year old, waiting is the hardest part of farming. Plant...W-A-I-T...Eat.

Growth is mostly waiting. Plant, Water, Sunshine, Plow, Fertilize, all are part of growing crops, but the process is mostly that one word – *wait*. Be patient Watchman. You sow. You wait. You water. You wait. One day, that person you've witnessed to ten times will get saved. It's worth the wait.

Prayer

Lord the harvest is Yours. You want people to be saved even more than I do. I will sow. I will pray. I will wait. You will grow the harvest.

PRAYER AND SOLUTUDE

"Early in the morning, while it was still dark, **Jesus got up and slipped out to a solitary place to pray**." (Mark 1:35)

But the news about Jesus spread all the more, and great crowds came to hear Him and to be healed of their sicknesses. Yet **He frequently withdrew to the wilderness to pray**. (Luke 5:15,16)

"One day soon afterward Jesus went up on a mountain to pray, and **He prayed to God all night.**" (Luke 6:12)

Jesus often prayed alone. He left the thousands to be with His Father. On some occasions, He took the disciples (Luke 9:28; Mark 14:32; Matt. 26:36), but He also instructed them to "come apart." He meant, get away from the crowd. Find peace. Find God. Watchmen must "come apart." Climb down from the wall, or find a quiet corner on the wall, and be alone with God.

It's impossible to be effective as an army without effective communication. A military uses radios, satellites, lasers, codes, flashing lights, and many other means to communicate. If the entire army is not moving together, they are all at risk. To succeed, an army must know the commander's plans. They must talk, so they move as one unit. A Watchman who does not communicate with God – often and alone, will be out of sync with the Commander's master plan.

Jesus prayed in a crowded Temple and in a quiet garden named Gethsemane. We must be men and women of prayer, but also solitude. You will have talks with God alone that you will never have in a room of others, even if they are all strong believers or other Watchmen. You need time alone, in private, in silence to have conversations with God that no one else would understand.

Where do you come apart, so you don't fall apart?

Prayer

Jesus, speak to me in this guiet, private moment. Please tell me Your plans.

When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he touched his hip socket, and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. But Jacob said, "I will not let you go unless you bless me." And he said to him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Jacob." Then he said, "Your name shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with men, and have prevailed." Then Jacob asked him, "Please tell me your name." But he said, "Why is it that you ask my name?" And there he blessed him." (Gen. 32:24-29)

There is no prevailing without travailing.

God is not displeased or frustrated by persistent, intense, even forceful prayer. He never says, "Not *her* again." Or, "Will he *ever* stop nagging Me?"

Jacob wrestled with God – his future depended upon God's blessing. We can feel for Jacob. He had no hope of winning, but he didn't quit. You go, Jake! We understand begging, even arguing with God. We get Jacob.

But why did *God* wrestle? We know Who wins that match every time.

I believe God wrestled because He *wanted* Jacob to struggle. God wanted Jacob to travail. It was painful – Jacob walked with a limp the rest of his life, but he also learned that on the other side of struggle is strength. On the other side of travail, is prevail. On the other side of broken is a blessing.

When Watchmen travail in prayer it's spiritual leverage. Movement takes place in the heavenlies. Watchmen don't just pray, they contend, persist, push. Increase the intensity of your cries for your city, your country, your family. Aggressively defend your wall!

Travail! Go bold! Pray forcefully! God is not overmatched by your requests. God is pleased with a Watchman's forceful prayers. *Travail*.

Prayer

Father, thank You for the pressure of prayer, the resistance of persistence. I give you my struggles. Please give me Your blessing. Many are lost. I plead for their lives.

Solomon, who had much, knew the value of little especially when it came to words. His wise counsel is to limit their quantity when you are in the King's presence. The King's time is valuable.

That doesn't mean your prayers can't be lengthy. It means that God isn't impressed by your words—their size or their number. Don't treat God like Scrabble. You don't get more points with Him because other people have to look up your verbiage in the dictionary or because your prayers are so long the hearers fall asleep. Get to the point.

Long, eloquent prayers might impress people, but you're not praying to them. They're not God, and they can't produce what you're after. If your goal is to impress God, try faith and humility. It doesn't take long to express belief in God's power and gratitude for his grace.

Solomon's admonition has nothing to do with God's lack of interest in your concerns or His pre-occupation with His own. God is always working, but He's never busy. The God of the universe has time for you. Come to Him humbly, simply, and without pretension. Let your words be few.

Father, thank you for taking the time to spend with me. I love you. I'm so glad you love me. I look forward to an eternity spent in Your presence.

Jesus experienced human emotions: sorrow, anger, satisfaction courage, and joy. A significant question persistently enters my mind – Did Jesus know the pleasure of laughter?

Jesus' mission was serious. He was mankind's Savior. The stakes were high. He knew the cost. Some would receive His words, but He mingled each day with others He loved who would face eternity separated from God. The only laughter that realization produces is the maniacal kind coming from those who find joy in others' pain.

My concern may seem irrelevant or even irreverent, but it has eternal ramifications. One day, when I kneel at Jesus' feet, what will it say about me if I can laugh in that place knowing that those I warned as a Watchman are not there? My laughter then and now says two things—I am made in the image of God, and I believe He is trustworthy.

Some of God's first recorded words communicate I am like Him. He, who knows the horrors of life and eternity better than I, still laughs. He must laugh because He instilled me with a love of laughter. Yes, darkness is all around me; it's not hard to find. But God's light is here too.

Prayer

God, may I never laugh at another's pain or at something that brings You sorrow. Take my laughter as a statement of faith. I know you've got this, and I don't need to fret. You, my Father, always do what is good and what's right.

WALK THE WALK AND TALK THE TALK

"Then Jephthah gathered together all the men of Gilead and fought against Ephraim. The men of Gilead defeated Ephraim...When any of the fleeing Ephraimites said, "Let me pass," the men of Gilead would say to him, "Are you an Ephraimite?" If he answered, "No!" they would ask him to say "Shibboleth." If he said "Sibboleth," not pronouncing it exactly right, they would seize him and kill him at the fords of the Jordan. Forty-two thousand Ephraimites fell at that time." (Judges 12:4-6)

Shibboleth is an obscure but important, biblical word. 3000 years ago, before military uniforms, Gilalite soldiers (the good guys) discovered enemy soldiers had infiltrated their ranks. This represented a *clear and present danger* to the people of Gilead. A simple test was devised to distinguish a **true** Gilalite from a fraud. The test? *Correctly pronounce the word,* **shibboleth**.

Evidently, the people of Gilead had a peculiar accent, which their enemy could not easily duplicate. This variance was especially evident when pronouncing the word *shibboleth*. Gilalites pronounced the word, *shibboleth*—their enemies pronounced the word, *sibboleth*. Gilead's leaders organized a surprise pronunciation test—a failing grade meant death by the sword.

Many *looked like* they belonged to the tribe of Gilead. They could dress the part and blend in, but they discovered that *looking the part* was not enough. There is an essential spiritual parallel. Being a *Watchman for the Lord* requires more than attending worship services, memorizing Scripture and *looking the part*. God wants those who lead and serve as *watchmen* to "walk the walk" and "talk the talk."

Over 3000 years ago a test was given to determine who was on the Lord's side—those who could not pass paid dearly. True believers and *Watchmen for the Lord* are (and help others become) faithful followers of Jesus Christ.

Prayer

Dear Lord, help me to be true to You, and bold for You. Help me pass every test so that at the final judgment I will see Your smile and hear the words, "Well done my good and faithful servant."

WALKING ON WATER

"...Peter got down out of the boat, walked on the water and came toward Jesus. But when he saw the wind, he was afraid and, beginning to sink, cried out, 'Lord, save me!' Immediately Jesus reached out his hand and caught him. 'You of little faith,' he said, 'why did you doubt?' (Matthew 14:29b-31)

Humanity is captivated by stories of the those who accomplish the impossible. Movies like *The Lord of The Rings*, or *Star Wars* use this theme. But real-life stories are the best. Nadia Comaneci's perfect score in the 1976 Olympics, Roger Bannister's record-breaking four-minute mile in 1954, or Bob Beamon's breaking the long jump world record **by nearly two feet** in the 1968 Olympics are monumental moments in sports. We cheer when the amazing happens. Many long to taste that kind of victory—to know the feeling of accomplishing what "can't be done."

The story of *Peter walking on water* (Matthew 14:22-33) is known inside and outside the church. It is a story that both peaks interest and touches the heart. But it is *more* than just a story about what happened some 2000 years ago—it demonstrates how God desires to work in us today. Here's the truth: *God desires to add 'extra' to our 'ordinary' so that we can accomplish the extraordinary. The impossible becomes possible when we follow God's leading, place our faith in Him, and operate in His power (Matt. 19:26).*

When we boldly follow His leading, we will live an incredible life and accomplish incredible things. This is the 'abundant life' Jesus spoke of in John 10:10. Go, believe, receive the impossible.

Saul and I have something in common. No, I'm not a king; that's not our similarity. Both of us have unusual heights. He was tall, and I am, shall we say, "height-challenged."

If I were living at the time men physically watched from the wall, I would not be the first choice for this position. Height gives a natural advantage to one whose primary function is to watch and warn of danger's advance. It also gives them greater ability to repel the enemy's attack. One downside: height makes them a more tempting and accessible target.

Saul's stature excited the people; he *looked* like a king. When he led them in battle, the enemy was more likely to take Israel seriously or so they thought. But it was another of Saul's characteristics that caused God to choose him. Not his tallness, but his smallness (1 Sam. 15:17).

God doesn't need our height or our position for us to be effective in our ministry. The enemies we watch for can't be seen with human eyes, so height gives no advantage. But God requires humility from Watchmen. "Tall" in our eyes or in the eyes of those we lead can result in misplaced trust and devotion.

Prayer

Father, thank You that in Your wisdom, You made me short. It increases my dependence on You. It also helps those I lead to see You more clearly because I have nothing which might block their view.

It's even more amazing when you consider that He hasn't just spoken to men in general; He's spoken to you. And the more you crave His presence, the greater His revelation of Himself will be.

Watchmen are soldiers fighting a spiritual battle. As long as they perform their task, does it really matter what they believe or that what they believe is true? "Just follow orders! Don't think or ask questions!" Countless militants have done their duty after hearing those harsh, demeaning words. Is that what Jesus calls us to?

When warriors don't know what they're doing, for whom they're doing it or why their loyalty and sacrifice diminishes. At best, they run when they see the enemy coming. Worse, they indiscriminately destroy everything in sight. Their lack of understanding led them to enlist for the wrong cause resulting in a terrible outcome.

God doesn't consider you cannon fodder, or expendable pawns on the chessboard whose only job is to draw out the enemy. He wants us to know battle details and goals. As a commander, He is not distant or unseen, we fight shoulder-to-shoulder. He desires an intimate relationship. He values us enough to show us what is true and gives us evidence to prove it.

What a Watchman believes determines who and for whom he will fight. It governs his tactics. That belief moved us from the enemy's camp into God's, and that belief will bring an end to the battle.

That may sound an odd thing to say. The reason Watchmen stand on the wall is because of what God's Word says. Of course, Watchmen believe the Bible! But do you?

What about that word "all?" You have no trouble believing the Bible's parts that describe a future no one has seen. What others doubt, you easily accept. You wonder how they fail to see what is so clear to you.

The Bible speaks of far more than the future. It speaks of laziness, sexuality, relationships, and finances. It commands us to speak the truth and do so in love. It promises strength and renewal to those who wait on the Lord. Jesus warned His disciples that persecution was coming but gave them instruction to respond with forgiveness and kindness. Do you believe these things too?

Let's test your belief. The last portion of the verses above describe God's man as "adequate" and "equipped." Do you believe that means you? Try saying it out loud: "I am adequate." "I am equipped." It almost sounds unspiritual to say. This is not prideful; this is faith. The adequacy comes from God, not from you. Do you believe what God says? *Everything* He says?

Prayer

Father, believing the Bible when it describes me as dirty and deserving of Hell is easy. But statements of my adequacy for the task You have given are much harder to accept. I want to please you, and faith is the only way.

Me, I need pizza, and not the kind that has locusts and honey for toppings. I've heard of some weird pizza additions, but most places don't carry these.

Pizza seems to be a common food choice for Watchmen. For a while, one of the indicators something big was happening in Wash, D.C. was the increase in pizza deliveries. People who defend our country frequently rely on pizza for their source of nutrition.

Jesus said what you put *in* your stomach doesn't create a spiritual problem. What flows *from* your mouth is the indicator of internal health. John's words were just as unusual as his diet. "Repent, for God's kingdom is coming (Matt. 3:2)." He was a Watchman when Watchmen were rare. He was healthy in an environment suffering from a deadly spiritual disease.

Pizza in moderation gives us something to enjoy. It can also draw a crowd. When it does, why not turn a chance to feed your face into an opportunity to feed their souls. Reserve the honey for biscuits. Keep the grasshoppers out in the yard. You don't need unusual toppings. An unusual but necessary message will do.

Prayer

Spirit, thank you for pizza! But thank you more for the mentors who use pizza and top it with love and a message to shape the lives of the young.

Life sometimes feels like it's passing in a fog. Sometimes our path isn't clear, and we're doing the best we can to place one foot in front of the other. If only we had a sign from above, we would know if we should take up watch in that new city, take that job or choose that church. It can be tempting to stop in our tracks and ask God for a sign before making a move.

Sometimes we are blessed with clear signs from our Father directing our path, yet sometimes we don't have the fleece as proof in the morning. So how can we make big life decisions when we're not sure what the future holds?

It is hard to have faith when our visibility is limited. Yet Jesus said those who trust without ever seeing Him are blessed.

Have you been waiting too long to see the proof in the fleece? Trust in His plan for you. Lift all things up to the Father. Spend time in the Word. There is wisdom in waiting, but don't remain stuck there. Believe that the Lord is working behind the scenes in your life, even if you don't see the signs today. You may be working with 6 inches of visibility, but God may be waiting for <u>you</u> to move in faith. The blessings will follow.

THE THIRD DAY

"From that time on Jesus began to explain to His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem, and that he must be killed and **on the third day** be raised to life." (Matthew 16:21)

Can you imagine how the disciples felt when Jesus was crucified? In Don Francisco's song, He's Alive Peter describes the despairing disciples.

"The gates and doors were barred, and all the windows fastened down. I spent the night in sleeplessness and rose at every sound. Half in hopeless sorrow, and half in fear the day, would find the soldiers breaking through to drag us all away."

The Bible does not detail the disciples' emotions, but clearly none of them expected to see a risen Lord Sunday morning. Don Francisco was right, the disciples were miserable for three days—but why? Jesus said He would die (Matt. 16:21), and would return. Hosea 6:2 prophesied Messiah's return the third day. We can trust God's promises and timing.

God's blessing often came on the third day, foreshadowing the Resurrection, and God's perfect timing. God provided a substitute sacrifice for Abraham on the *third day* (Genesis 22). Joshua led Israel across the Jordan *on the third day* (Joshua 3). King Hezekiah was forgiven and healed *on the third day* (2 Kings 20). Esther approached the king and saved her people *on the third day* (Esther 5). Jonah was rescued *after three days* (Jonah 2).

Have hope Watchmen; be patient. God comes at the perfect time. "Therefore do not grow weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap the harvest, if we do not give up" (Galatians 6:9)

There is so much to provoke anger. Turn on the news—local or national—and you will hear accounts that make you angry and others that resulted from anger. So you turn off the TV and pull up YouTube.

After you tire of the funny cat videos, your search produces a message with false truth. Here at least, you can give a reply. You're tempted to hit the ALL-CAPS button and pound your keys in response as if that will give greater weight to your comments. You're angry, and you want someone to know it!

Sin and lies *must* make us angry. They motivate us to action. But anger can't be what characterizes a Watchman's service. Righteousness and love are the things others must see.

You say, "Didn't Jesus show anger?" Yes, He did. But how many times can you point to? And how does that compare to the number of times He had just cause to yell? Jesus got angry, but He never allowed anger to get Him. He was always its master.

Prayer

Lord, as I sit at my keyboard and contemplate how to respond, help me to follow Your example instead of following the enemy's. You, Who could have destroyed Your accusers, chose silence instead. Help me to know when to speak and how to communicate so *Your* message gets through.

Perhaps you've made a million and one excuses to not speak up when it comes to sharing your faith (you're not alone). Your mouth will almost move, and then the doubt hits like a ton of bricks. What if they ask a question I can't answer? What if I misquote scripture? What if I look crazy? What if I fall short of representing Christ?

Sometimes the idea of sharing our faith can be overwhelming. But when Paul wrote to the people of the early churches, he encouraged them to be able to defend their own hope. Not perfectly defend the faith, not beautifully debate apologetics or semantics, but defend their own hope.

Some don't share anything because they feel like they have to know everything. Yet Christ calls on us to share what we know. Share what He has done and is doing in your life. You don't have to know every name and date and detail to speak of the hope that lives within you. Be brave. Paint a word picture of how Christ has shaped your story. Perhaps it will be the start of a new chapter for someone else.

Prayer

Father, I pray for an opportunity to share your love with someone around me today. Grant me courage and wisdom to best represent you with the story you've created in me!

YELLING ABOVE THE CROWD

Yelling at the crowd is not warning the crowd. Some teachers yell. When there is an unruly classroom, they get louder to be heard above the noise. Some parents do the same. If the child is loud, the parent speaks louder. It doesn't work. In either case, the children also want to be heard, so they get louder. The circus only ends when the authority threatens or demands the right to be heard. I did the same, as a teacher and parent.

My elementary supervisor taught me the secret. It's so simple, most overlook it – lower your voice. Speak quietly. The noisy class can't hear so they hush. You must be heard, loud is ok for "Get out of the street!" For "This will be on the test" quiet is better. Why must they hear your directive? Because you see the danger or have the truth.

Watchmen risk always screaming. The world is uncontrolled ...and in danger. Will louder preaching, more bombastic videos, or more threats of doom work? For some. But God knows the secret—not fires, or earthquakes or tornados, no. a still small voice. The world needs more *still small voices* (1 Kings 9:12). Authority with love. Truth with grace. Warning, urgency and control. The Authority is in your words—His words.

Prayer

God of truth, authority, mercy, and love, I want to speak with all of those. I will learn to sound like lesus and win a loud uncontrolled world to You

Each attempt brings us closer to knowing ourselves, and learning our weaknesses can help us discover our strengths!

So if you don't wake up each morning automatically knowing where you spiritually excel, don't lose heart. Our gifts are continually growing and changing as we do, and sometimes we have to dig a little before we uncover our own potential.

Dig. The world needs what you'll discover.

God gave the first man and wife to each other as helpmates. God prepared yours to be the same. Your vows to God as a Watchmen or Watchwomen don't supersede or nullify the promises you made to each other. Protect your spouse first, not from the battle but in it. The more devotion you give, the more effective a Watchman or Watchwoman you'll be.

WATCHMEN SIN by Watchman James Q

"If we continue to confess our sins, God is faithful and righteous to forgive us the sins, and to cleanse us from every unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).

Scripture is clear: when the believer confesses a sin to God, God forgives. To merely report a sin, however, is not confession. Confession is agreeing with God that we sinned against Him (Psalm 51:4). Confession also requires repentance. We agree with God that we sinned against Him (confession), we turn from our sin (repentance) and return to God.

To conclude we deserve punishment for our sin is neither confession nor repentance. God forgives those who repent and confess, He does not punish confession and repentance. Biblical repentance is sorrow for rebellion against God, accompanied with the sincere intent to change our behavior so the rebellion is not repeated.

When the believer confesses sin, Christ addresses the Father (1 John 2:1), "Yes Father, that person sinned and deserves death. Remember I paid for that sin on the cross when I suffered Your wrath and My physical death. The debt is paid, and this saved person, Our child, must be forgiven. They have confessed and repented of sin and must be restored to fellowship and service."

God doesn't forgive sins just to be a nice guy. God forgives sins because Christ paid the penalty for every sinful act any believer might commit past, present, or future (1 John 2:2). We are always forgiven when we agree with God.

Father God, I agree with You and Your Word. I have sinned. I repent. Christ suffered and died. I am forgiven.

DAY 97 A PILE OF ROCKS

"Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise, the fruit of lips that confess His name. And do not neglect to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased." (Hebrews 13:15,16)

Altars and Wells appear throughout the Old Testament. Building an altar, or digging a well was a sacred act. Wells brought the water of life. Altars made sacrifice to God, but there was much more to it than water and rocks.

Altars were symbolic and sacred. They were used when they were built, but they were often left standing for future generations. Children, grandchildren, and unrelated future generations told the story of each altar. Altars share several characteristics which Watchmen understand and build into their daily walk and the legacy they leave future generations.

- Something always died there. Sacrifice never turned out well for the sheep. We lay down our lives to walk the wall.
- The place became holy. A prayer altar established holy ground. Have a sacred place where you meet God.
- Altars remind another generation. Always be sowing seed. You may reap a harvest, or you may not, but always be sowing.
- Redemption was not earned, it was burned. Christ' death is our eternal sacrifice. The next generation must be told.
- Cold dead stones bring life to the world. The same is true at the wall. It is your platform, but also the place of sacrifice.

Becoming a Watchman defines sacrifice. The world needs your warning. The Church requires your witness. Family follows your faithfulness. Build altars.

Lord, my small sacrifices do not compare to Yours. Sanctify my sacrifice with Your presence. Touch the next generation with Your message.
