### **GOD IS OFFERING YOU A SECOND CHANCE**

### **COULD GOD BE CALLING YOU TO BE A LEADER IN HIS GREAT WORK?**

Could it be that God is calling you to do something significant for Him? Could it be that God desires to use you to serve as a leader in the new, post-Rapture church? Don't be quick to discount the possibility that God may have great plans in mind for you. As for excuses, I'm sure you have some—even a few good ones. I assure you; God has heard them before and from some notable fellows. The prophet Jeremiah, for example, told God he was too young. Abraham and Sarah probably questioned whether or not they were too old. Moses gave God five excuses and even provided the name of someone he felt could do a better job. Peter provided a most poignant excuse when he told Jesus he could not want to use him, for he was a 'sinful man.' It doesn't matter what you've done—what matters is what you are willing to do now?

The bottom line is, God can use anyone, at any time, to do anything. This is a critical point in the history of planet earth. The 'church' is gone. Pastors who taught truth and served well are gone. Those who loved and followed the Lord were Raptured and are now in heaven.
