Post-Rapture World: Reasons for Hope

Many Spiritual truths are at odds with the prevailing logic of the world: *To be first, you must be willing to be last; give, and you shall receive; humble yourself, and you will be exalted* are a few examples. The answers to where to find hope may seem to be a paradox. Many believe hope for the future is strongly tied to being comfortable and at peace today. This mindset makes us extremely vulnerable to Satan's attacks. The things of this world may provide temporary joy, but it is fleeting. Things like a job, home, money, power, and possessions may offer a temporary sense of security, but lasting, satisfying hope only exists in the spiritual realm. Our hope is in God alone.

During the Tribulation Period, many will lose their home, job, money, and more. Those who put their trust and hope in things will despair when those things disappear. As believers, we must share that the source of hope is Jesus Christ and that no power or catastrophe on earth can take that away.

The Apostle Paul wrote that he had "learned to be content in every circumstance" (Phil. 4:11). He was able to do this because his attitude was not linked to his circumstances. God alone determined Paul's attitude and gave him hope. This is how Paul was able to "Give thanks in <u>everything</u>" (1 Thess. 5:18). He was not encouraging people to be joyful and thankful <u>for</u> everything, but <u>in</u> everything. Bad things happen, and the things of this world can be lost, stolen, or destroyed.

Joy, peace, and hope cannot be lost if they are rooted in the things of God. Find your hope in Him!
